С	Vision panels or covers on classroom doors that prevent viewing into the classroom and allow a blind area to "hide" during a lockdown.	
D	Bleeding control materials and AEDs (Automatic External Defibrillator).	
Е	Intercom / 2-way communication system .	
F	Visitor management system.	
G	Safety measures for buses and transportation (cameras, radios, etc.).	
Н	Numbers on classroom interior and exterior surfaces (wall, door, or window) that are easily identifiable to first responders.	
I	Touch bar exit devices to replace crash bar exterior door egress hardware, including replacement of doors if necessary.	
J	Visible signage on school campuses to clearly identify visitor requirements, closed campus areas, and traffic flow.

L	Grand master key system for the school district, ensuring that each campus has a master key available and may be provided or accessible to local law enforcement for use during a critical incident.
