## Provision 2 Issues <br> Questions and Answers

1. If an elementary student in a Provision $\mathbf{2}$ school in the district receives breakfast and lunch without charge, do the siblings in the family household at other schools in the district automatically qualify for free meals?

No. If the district uses the Provision 2 alternative at individual schools in the district, parents must fill out a household application and pay for the meal, based on eligibility determination, for other children in the household that do not attend a Provision 2 school in the district. Use of the Provision 2 alternative on a school by school basis is based on the district's decision.
2. If I have a Provision 2 school and non Provision 2 school(s) in the district, do I fill out one claim for reimbursement?

Yes. Although the district may submit one aggregate or total "district" claim for reimbursement, separate records for Provision 2 students and non Provision 2 students based on the point of service counts must be maintained to provide documentation for the claim for reimbursement.
3. How does having individual Provision 2 school(s) in the district affect measurement of academic progress?

Since all students in a Provision 2 school are reported at 100\% free, automatic sub-groupings for measurement of academic progress and interventions may be created. As these students feed into other schools, there is no individual poverty level data to follow the student.
4. What will trigger the requirement to do a new base year?

Any changes in student attendance areas, student grade levels, consolidations or mergers and annexation within a district can trigger a new base year.
