<p>01 Drugs- Excluding alcohol and tobacco, (illegal drug possession, sale, use/under the influence): Unlawful use, cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, solicitation, purchase, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug (e.g. Demerol, morphine, marijuana, LSD, narcotic substance, or inhalant. This includes taking someone else’s prescription medicine.</p>	<p>01 Drugs- Excluding alcohol and tobacco, (illegal drug possession, sale, use/under the influence): Unlawful use, cultivation, manufacture, distribution, sale, solicitation, purchase, possession, transportation, or importation of any controlled drug (e.g. Demerol, morphine, marijuana, LSD, <u>opioid.etc...</u>), narcotic substance, or inhalant. This includes taking someone else’s prescription medications. <u>Useofanysubstanceagainstschoolpolicy.</u></p>
<p>02 Alcohol- (liquor law violations – possession, use sale): Violations of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or consumption of intoxicating alcoholic beverages or substances represented as alcohol. Suspicion of being under the influence of alcohol may be included if it results in disciplinary action.</p>	<p>02 Alcohol- (liquor law violations – possession, use sale): Violations of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or consumption of intoxicating alcoholic beverages or substances represented as alcohol. Suspicion of being under the influence of alcohol may be included if it results in disciplinary action.</p>
<p>03 Tobacco- (Cigarettes or other forms of tobacco) – The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation by any person under the age of 18. This shall include e-cigarettes (E-NIC) or personal vaporizers.</p>	<p>03 Tobacco/<u>e-Cigarettes/Vaping Devices-</u> (Cigarettes or other forms of tobacco) – The possession, use, distribution, or sale of tobacco products on school grounds, at school-sponsored events, or on school transportation <u>by any student.</u> This shall include e-cigarettes or personal vaporizers.</p>
<p>04 Truancy- Any absence of part of a day, or all of a day, or for more than one day from school which the school attendance officer, principal or guardian is not aware of and some means intermittently carried on for the purpose of defeating the intent of compulsory education.</p>	<p>04 <u>Attendance Policy Violation-</u> Any absence of part of a day, or all of a day, or for more than one day from school which the school attendance officer, principal, <u>parent,</u> or guardian is not aware <u>for the purpose of defeating the intent of compulsory education.</u></p>
<p>05 Student Assault – Battery (physical attack/harm): Examples include striking that causes bleeding, broken nose; kicking while a student is down. Consider age and developmentally appropriate behavior before using this category. This category should be used when the attack is serious enough to warrant calling the police or security or when serious bodily harm occurs. Include an attack with a weapon in this category. (This offense may be referred to by law enforcement as aggravated assault.)</p>	<p>05 <u>Physical Attack/Harmon Student-</u> Examples include striking that causes bleeding, broken nose; kicking. Consider age and developmentally appropriate behavior before using this category. This category may be used when the attack is serious enough to warrant calling the police or security or when serious bodily harm occurs. Includes an attack with a weapon in this category.</p>
<p>06 Staff Assault – An attempt to cause purposely, knowingly, or recklessly bodily injury to staff; or negligently causing bodily injury to staff with a deadly weapon.</p>	<p>06 <u>Physical Attack/Harmon Staff-</u> Examples include <u>striking that causes bleeding, broken nose; kicking. Consider age and developmentally appropriate behavior before using this category. This category may be used when the attack is serious enough to warrant calling the police or security or when serious bodily harm occurs. Include an attack with a weapon in this category.</u></p>

<p>07 Knife- These weapons include the instrument or object used such as a sharp object (e.g., razor blade, ice pick, Chinese star).</p>	<p>07 Knife- <u>Includes instruments or objects</u> used such as a sharp object (e.g., knife, razor blade, ice pick, Chinese star).</p>
<p>HANDGUNS, RIFLES, AND SHOTGUNS- Possession of an instrument or object defined as a firearm and used to inflict harm on other persons. Any weapon (including a starter gun) which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to expel a projectile by the action of any explosive; the frame or receiver of any weapon described above; and any firearm muffler or firearm silencer. Handgun- A firearm (revolver or pistol) designed to be held and fired with one hand. Rifle- A shoulder weapon. Shotgun- A smoothbore shoulder weapon used for firing shots at short range.</p>	<p>HANDGUNS, RIFLES, AND SHOTGUNS- Possession of an instrument or object defined as a firearm and used to inflict harm on other persons. <p>15 Disorderly Conduct- (significantly disrupts all or portions of the campus activities, school sponsored events or school bus transportation) – Disruptive behavior that poses a serious threat to the learning environment, health, safety, or welfare of others.</p>	<p>15 Disorderly Conduct- (significantly disrupts all or portions of the campus activities, school sponsored events or school bus transportation) – Disruptive behavior that poses a serious threat to the learning environment, health, safety, or welfare of others.</p>
<p>16 Explosives- Incendiary, or poison gas; any weapon which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter, i.e., Bomb; Grenade, Rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces, Missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than one-quarter ounce, Mine, or Similar device.</p>	<p>16 Explosives- Incendiary or poison gas; any weapon which will, or which may be readily converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive or other propellant, and which has any barrel with a bore of more than one-half inch in diameter, i.e., Bomb; Grenade, Rocket having a propellant charge of more than four ounces, Missile having an explosive or incendiary charge of more than one-quarter ounce, Mine, or Similar device.</p>

<p>17 Other- This involves those items not listed elsewhere.</p>	<p>17 Other- <u>This option ONLY encompasses infractions not listed. This category is designated for discipline violations that are non-violent or do NOT fit in any of the categories as defined elsewhere in the coding chart. (Examples include: horseplay, profanity, cheating, gambling, plagiarism, pornography, non-violent disruptive behavior, dress code, no homework, chewing gum, excessive talking, and other general classroom management or school ground violations.)</u></p>
<p>18 Bullying- Unwanted and repeated written, verbal, or physical behavior, including any threatening, insulting, or dehumanizing gesture, by a student that is severe or pervasive enough to create an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment, caused discomfort or humiliation, or unreasonably interfered with the individual's school performance or participation. Also included here is Cyber Bullying: Intentional and repeated harm inflicted through the use of computers, cell phones, and other electronic devices. This includes ALL social media private or public.</p>	<p>18 Bullying- <u>Intentional harassment, intimidation, humiliation, ridicule, defamation, or threat or incitement of violence by a student against another student or public school employee by a written, verbal, or physical act that causes or creates actual or reasonably foreseeable physical harm, interference with a student's education or employee's role in education, substantial disruption in the operation of the school, and/or a hostile educational environment.</u></p>
<p>19 Fighting- Violent incidents without injury (physical altercation, minor (pushing, shoving); fighting (mutual altercation); school threat (threat of destruction or harm); threat/intimidation (causing fear of harm), harassment nonsexual (physical, verbal, or psychological) and harassment, sexual (unwelcome sexual conduct).</p>	<p>19 Fighting- Violent incidents <u>with or</u> without injury (physical altercation, pushing, shoving); fighting (mutual altercation)</p>
<p>20 Cellphone/Electronic Device/Technology Violation- Using electronic devices against school policy</p>	<p>20 Personal Electronic Device- Use of electronic devices <u>that violate</u> school policy.</p>
<p>21 Cyberbullying- According to A.C.A. 5-71-217, Cyberbullying is electronic communication of information of a person's school between or among points specified by the person without change in the form or content of the information sent and received and electronic means of text, visual, written or oral communication of any kind made through the use of a computer online service, internet service, telephone or any other means of electronic communications, including with limitation to local bulletin board service, an internet chat room, electronic mail, social networking site or an online messaging service.</p>	<p>21 Cyberbullying- <u>Any form of communication or posting content by electronic act that is sent with the purpose to harass, intimidate, humiliate, defame, incite violence to or threaten a student, public school employee, or person with whom the other student or public school employee is associated.</u></p>

<p>23 Public Display of Affection - Are acts of physical intimacy or affection in the view of others e.g. kissing, holding hands, sexual acts that's not conducive to concentration or learning.</p>	<p>23 Sexual Behavior- Mutual sexual acts including sexual intercourse, fondling, nudity, etc...</p>
<p>24 Stealing/Theft- To take another's property, e.g. student's or school, without the verbal or written permission of owner and no return it.</p>	<p>24 Stealing/Theft- To take another's property (student's or school) without the verbal or written permission of owner and <u>with no intent to</u> return it.</p>
<p>25 Terroristic Threats- Threats to commit any crime of violence against another person with the intent to terrorize.</p>	<p>25 Terroristic Threats- <u>Are threats to kill or to cause serious physical injury to another person.</u></p>
	<p>26 Sexual Harassment- Is when a student engages <u>repetitively in behavior that involves unwelcome sexual advances, unwelcome touching that is sexual in nature, unwelcome requests for sexual favors from or offers sexual favors to another student such that the conduct has the purpose or effect of interfering with the other's performance in the school environment.</u></p>
