



Reporting

- The federal government gives guidance Non-Regulatory Guidance for the Report Card.
- •The Report Card collects data from cycle reports.

 Graduation Rates along with other information will continue to be reported.





COVID-19 Graduation Requirements

Class of COVID 19

•Whether a senior is "on track to graduate and in good standing as of the 3rd nine weeks" is a local school district decision that will be made by school administration.

- This determination should be made based on a review of student data including, but not limited to, grades and credits earned.
- Districts may have additional requirements for specific designations upon graduation or opportunities for seniors to continue engagement for the remainder of the school year.



Cycle Reporting Dates and Data Timelines <u>Statewide Information Cycle (Cycle Reporting:</u> <u>Cycles 7,8,9</u>)

The remaining cycles for the 2019-2020 school year are listed below:

- •Cycle 7: June 1, 2020 June 30, 2020* •Cycle 8: July 15, 2020 - July 31, 2020
- •Cycle 9: August 15, 2020 August 31, 2020

*The deadline for Cycle 7 has been extended to June 30, 2020, for the 2019-2020 school year for all school districts.



Information to Keep in Mind!



- Verify that **each** graduating student is marked with the correct graduation year to prevent graduates from rolling over into the next school year.
- The Graduation date that should be placed in e-school is the date that the student finishes all requirements for graduation and **NOT** *the date of ceremony*. The graduation date needs to be marked correctly on the student Academic Screen.
- For graduates, especially summer graduates, be sure that their graduation date is prior to August 15th.



Understanding Certified Data

- Correct E-School codes must be used when dropping students.
- E-School entry/withdrawal screens are essential when verifying a student's enrollment status. (TRIAND is good, but e-School is best.)
- E-School entry/withdrawal codes are needed to document student transfers.
- The following chart shows the E-school and SIS codes to remove an <u>on-time</u> student from a cohort.

SIS codes that <u>can</u> remove a student from cohort






Common Errors

- Trying to remove students that have repeated a grade.
- Homeschool paperwork that identifies the curriculum as GED.
- Attempting to remove students that are incarcerated for any length of time that are *not* committed to a DYS facility.





Multiple State ID's

- A student should always keep the same state ID while being educated in Arkansas.
- If a student's state ID has been changed for any reason, schools must identify the duplicate state ID numbers and immediately request for the state IDs to be merged.
- Duplicate state ID's can cause serious issues in calculating graduation rates and other accountability designations.



Example:

- School A can have a student with a state ID and the student transfers to school B under a different state ID.
 - School A will show the student as a non graduate but, the student actually graduated from school B under a different state ID.
 - The student can be removed from school A's cohort because the student transferred to another Arkansas school.
 - School B can add the student to the cohort as an actual graduate.
 - Multiple state ID's should be caught during the cycle submission process.

Adjusted Cohort Facts

- A student can repeat the 9th grade in an adjusted cohort and still be on-time.
- The student will count against the district rate but the student will be on-time for the school.







Credits Versus Years

- A student can graduate on-time even if the student falls behind on credits. The federal guidance looks for the number of years it takes for a student to graduate. Students can take advantage of programs that support on-time graduation:
 - Concurrent Credits
 - Credit Recovery
 - Summer School
- If a student repeats a grade in a 4 year cohort and does not graduate, the student has an opportunity to be a part of the 5th year cohort.



Early Graduates



- If a student graduates in less than 4 years, the student is banked until the year of graduation.
 - The student will show as a No graduate in the 4th year cohort list.
 - To update the student's status, District level users can go into the Graduation Cohort Correction system and select Correct a Cohort Record. The user will need to change the graduation status from NO to Yes and upload the 3 year transcript with seal, signature, and date as evidence to support the correction.



Early Graduates

- Many times schools add students to the cohort during the year of graduation because the student's name does not appear on the graduation list. This is a common error, that can result in a denial of the correction.
- The student will be identified with the initial graduation cohort.







Facts about the 5th Year Cohort

- Students can be removed from 5th year cohort.
- The students must be on-time transfers.
- The system is looking for 5th year completers.

Deleting a Cohort Record

Deleting a cohort record decreases the number of expected Graduates which improves your graduation rate pending correction approval. Correcting a Cohort Record

- Correcting a cohort record can only increase the number of students that are actual graduates.
- This correction type cannot be used to delete a student record.
- Selecting the wrong correction type will not change your rates.
- This correction can be used to identify a student that was not reported as actual graduate.

Special Correction

- A special correction request can be used to track duplicate State ID's.
- DESE will research the transfer and status of student in SIS data.
- Districts with a high number of duplicate ID's could be subject to review.



the cohort.



Select a reason to \bigcirc Remove/Transfer to Another Arkansas school to delete a student from a cohort. Use the drop down menu to select additional options.





Correcting a Cohort Record

 If a student was marked as a No graduate, a correction can be made to change the student to an actual graduate by changing a No to a Yes.









Common Errors in Corrections Process: Uploading a File Mond

- Only one file can be uploaded to a correction request.
- So, if you have multiple documents to upload, they need to first be combined into one file and then uploaded.
- If you upload more than one file, the corrections system will maintain the most recently uploaded file.

A copy of official transcript is required. The official graduation date must be visible on the attachment. Please provide comments and upload supporting document.






Federal Expected Rate for 5 Year Graduation Cohort
